He dreamt of an alternative education – there had to be a better way, so he went to university, studied education and joined the Tasmanian Education Department. David had a special interest in

children's education. He used art as a means of reaching out to children, many of whom were from underprivileged backgrounds and had no wish to attend school. He used the power of art for parents and students to encourage one another. The children's art was often outstanding, which had the flow on effect of involving parents and teachers in their successes.

David has written several books documenting his experiences and successes. His presentation inspired and reinforced the important role of teachers and other educators.

September Presentation - BOB GOSSI



Our speaker for September is the highly successful businessman and administrator, Bob Gozzi.

Bob remembers the first time he walked through the doors of AFL headquarters in Melbourne armed with Tasmania's case for a team in the big time. It was 1994. He will share that journey with us as well as many more of his achievements over the past five decades.

Bob came to Tasmania in 1978 to join Cadbury Schweppes. He co-founded the Cadbury Marathon with Ted Best, which after 41 years is the longest continuous marathon event in

Australia. He was President of the Sandy Bay Football Club and Chief Commissioner of the Tasmanian Football League. He was also a member of the Australian Football Foundation Board for 10 years and chaired the Joint Working Group to bring AFL (North Melbourne) to Hobart.

His service to the business community includes appointment as inaugural Commissioner of the Tasmanian Industrial Commission, President of the TCCI, Board member of the Australian Chamber of Commerce and Industry and Chair of the Workers Compensation Committee.

He has also proactively engaged with the wider community as member of numerous advisory boards and committees.


Post Meeting Yacht Club Lunch~ (John Carter)

It's Scams Awareness Week!




Scams Awareness Week (SAW) is an annual scams awareness raising campaign delivered by Scamwatch's National Anti-Scam Centre.

Kelly Country Tour



Members are reminded that a Kelly Country tour is planned for April $(1^{st} - 4^{th})$ 2025. We are calling for expressions of interest in September and commitment in November.

This tour is ex Melbourne and a full itinerary and other details are provided at the end of this bulletin.

At \$1293 pp (twin/double share), it represents excellent value. The airfare has been left out of the costings so that members can take advantage of frequent flyer points by making their own bookings, and where desired might also include any extended travel plans.

KEY POINTS

- This is a deluxe coach tour, fully escorted with driver and hostess with additional specialist guides used in some locations. Minimum 20 travellers, the coach can take up to 35. If numbers are greater, we can split into 2 tours.
- The tour commences from the Ibis Hotel in Therry Street Melbourne at 8.45 on Tuesday 1st April. Return to the Ibis Hotel on Friday 4th April around 5.30pm.
- Air flights and hotel accommodation required pre and post tour are an individual responsibility. It is suggested that due to possible flight schedule delays, accommodation arrangements be booked at the Ibis Hotel for the pre tour night of the 31st March. Depending upon individual circumstances it may also suit some travellers to stay overnight at the Ibis post tour on 4th April.
- Currently there are limited frequent flyer flights before and after the tour where bonus points can be utilised if required. Our tour operators are currently negotiating a "discounted rate" with the Ibis Hotel for us. More on this later.

We are now seeking "Expressions of interest" for this tour by completing the form to be passed around at our Probus meetings in September and October. Commitments by way of deposits will be required by 15th November and balance by 7th February.

Note that partners, family and friends are most welcome.

KELLY COUNTRY TOUR



Hobart Probus Club Tuesday 1st to Friday 4th April 2025



Day 1 - Tuesday 1st April -

This morning we depart and travel through to the Yarra Valley to the township of Healesville where we stop and visit the acclaimed Healesville Sanctuary. After visiting the sanctuary we go back in to Healesville for some free time to wander the streets and get some lunch (own expense). Having enjoyed all Healesville has to offer we reboard the coach and make our way to Mansfield, sitting at the foothills of the Victorian Alps, and the ski fields of Mt Buller. The town has a rich history dating back to the 1830's including it's time as a pastoral run, to the discovery of gold, and the significance of the Ned Kelly story. We will have a chance to explore this beautiful little hamlet before we check-in for our first night on tour.

Day 2 - Wednesday 2nd April -

After a hearty breakfast we depart our motel and head towards Milawa passing via Powers Lookout which provides unparalleled vistas of the Upper King Valley and the Alpine National Park, it is believed the lookout was a vantage point for bushranger Harry Power to view approaching troopers during his period of notoriety in the north-east in the 1860s. Continuing on we make our way through the King Valley and Milawa where we will stop to take in some of the local delicacies before making our way to the beautiful township of Beechworth ... upon arriving we will be met by a local guide who will join us on the coach as we discover more about this historic township. Having completed our guided tour we have time to wander the eclectic mix of stores that make up Beechworth and purchase lunch (at own expense) at one of the many little cafes or eateries, or the famous Beechworth Bakery. You can also visit the Beechworth Honey shop where you can taste the many flavours of their honey, the old telegraph station where you can actually still send telegraphs. This afternoon will have us visit the old court house where we partake in a reenactment of one of the trials of Ned Kelly. Having heard the verdict of Ned being handed down we jump back on the coach for the journey back to Wangaratta.

Day 3 - Thursday 3rd April -

This morning after our breakfast we head to Bright where we meet a local guide and commence our tour of Bright and Wandiligong. Our guide will share with us the fascinating history of Bright, and where we will be in awe of some of the magnificent gardens and tree lined streets as Bright shows off her best. After enjoying some time wandering the hamlet of Bright and lunch at own expense we're off to the stunningly beautiful Mt Buffalo. Reaching up to just over 1700 metres above sea level, and having had land reserved

in the 1890's, Mt Buffalo is one of Australia's oldest national parks. We will stop at the beautiful old Mt Buffalo Chalet, built in 1910 it is currently undergoing a magnificent restoration, and the views from Barents Lookout straight over the Ovens Valley are second to none. From here we return back to our motel in Wangaratta.

Day 4 - Friday 4th April –

This morning we put our bags back on the coach for our down the Hume Highway and back in to Melbourne ... but before we conclude our tour we visit another must see on the Ned Kelly trail and stop at Glenrowan and from there on to Benalla, both towns having connection to Ned and his exploits. Lunch today is included at the Royal Hotel before making our way towards home ...
